LIGHT FROM A CROSS

READ John 8:12-19

When Jesus spoke again to the people, he said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

— John 8:12 (NIV)

On Christmas Day, 2020, I was sitting in my friend's living room in Tønsberg, Norway, looking at the old watchtower on top of Fortress Hill. Churches were closed because of the COVID-19 pandemic. I had not seen my children and grand-

children since March, and I felt lonely and sorry for myself — in spite of being with my friend.

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY
The light of Christ is stronger than my loneliness.

To my surprise, I noticed that on top of the tower a

large cross spread its light over all the town. I sensed new feelings within me, as if my gloomy thoughts and self-pity must yield to the light from the cross.

Jesus told us he is the light of the world. And in that moment it was as if Jesus was assuring me, "You are never alone as long as I am with you, and I have not and will never forsake you. Darkness will give way to dawn. Wait and see." I rested my eyes on the cross that shined light not only over the town but in my heart as well — and I was comforted.

Prayer: Dear God, thank you for your light in the world and in our lives. Thank you for your love that never leaves us alone. Amen.

April Fools' Day Weather Surprises

April comes from the Latin word aperio, "to open" (bud), because plants begin to grow during this month.

April Fools' Day is fairly close to Spring; a time of the year when weather is known to play tricks on us with unpredictable changes to the weather, including:

- In 1923 temperatures reached -34°F in Bergland, Michigan.
- In 1960, up to 10" of heavy snow fell in eastern South Dakota causing havoc.
- In 1997, a blizzard from Maryland to Maine resulted in power outages and impassable road. East Jewett NY recorded 37" and 25.4" fell in Boston, Mass.




You Took My Parking Space at Church

With spring here, let's hope the wintery mix of weather has gone away. We're back on track for collecting items for the mission Adopt A Soldier. April's list is below.





